

## *Descendants of John R. Balch*

### *Generation No. 1*

1. JOHN R.<sup>2</sup> BALCH (?<sup>1</sup>) was born 11 Oct 1810 in Tennessee or Kentucky, USA, and died 30 Jul 1892 in Gallatin, Sumner, Tennessee, USA. He married SOPHIA STONE 17 Jan 1833 in Sumner, Tennessee, USA, daughter of NICHOLAS STONE and ELIZABETH LOVING. She was born 06 Aug 1814 in Gallatin, Sumner, Tennessee, USA, and died 05 Sep 1885 in Gallatin, Sumner, Tennessee, USA.

Notes for JOHN R. BALCH:

There is no Balch or Baulch listed in the 1830 Census of Sumner County, so it is presumed that John R. Balch moved to Sumner County, Tennessee between the 1830 census taking and January 17, 1833 when he was licensed to marry Sophia Stone.

1840 Census of Sumner County, Tennessee; Sixth Census of the United States, page 47, lists John Balch and his family as follows:

Free White Males: one under age 5, one age 5-10, one age 30-40 (this would be John and sons William Nicholas and Alfred Nelson, although both sons were under the age of five at the time of the census)

Free While Females: one under age 5, one age 5-10, one age 10-15, one age 30-40 (this would be Sophia and daughters Mary Catherine and Elizabeth F., although both daughters were between 5-10 at the time of the census; it is not known who the person age 10-15 might have been)

No Free Colored Persons recorded; No Slaves recorded.

Note: The ages for Susan Eliza, Martha, and Nancy appear incorrect in this census. According to later census data and the John R. Baulch Family Bible, at this point in time, they were 5, 3, and 2, respectively.

Note: The age for Susan appears incorrect in this census. She would have been 25 at this time. Robert Higgason (misspelled as Hickison in the 1870 Census) came to live with the Baulch family some time after his father, John W. Higgason, was killed in the Civil War in 1864. Siblings Sarah and Fountain were taken in by the William Nicholas Baulch family (household 108). Son Alfred is recorded in household 107.

The 1878 map of District 9 (Gallatin and areas northwest) identifies the properties of J. Baulch (John Baulch) and A. Baulch (Alfred Baulch) on Douglass Pike.

Of note, regarding the aforementioned census information is the following:

- 1) John Balch listed his birthplace state as Tennessee; family legend led us to believe that he was from Kentucky; in this same census, Alfred Balch listed his father, John's, birthplace state as Kentucky.
- 2) Suffia Balch is Sophia Stone Balch; the phonetic spelling reinforces the presumption that many census takers were uneducated.
- 3) Susus E. Balch is Susan E. Balch. In this census her health condition is listed as "paralyzed."
- 4) Jane Lindsay is Matilda Jane Balch Lindsay. Her husband, William H. Lindsay, is not listed in the 1880 Census for Sumner County, but Jane Lindsay listed her marital status as "Married" and not "Widowed" or "Divorced".
- 5) The ages of Susan and Matilda Jane are reversed.

Nothing definitive is known about John R. Balch's parents. The only documented clue we have is from the 1880 Census where he reported that his father was from Scotland and his mother was from Ireland. Yet, we do not really know if John's family came from Scotland and Ireland. Howard Stone Baulch's father and uncles (James H. Baulch, Ernest F. Baulch, and Nelson H. Baulch) passed along that the Baulch family came from Germany originally and that the "u" was dropped to Americanize the name. It is possible that the family could have migrated from Germany to Scotland and later to the States, but we can find no

evidence to support that nor any evidence of Baulches in Germany. The similar name in Germany is Bolich.

The following information is transcribed from a letter by family researcher, Jessie Nimmo Hunter, passed from James Homer Baulch to Howard Stone Baulch, regarding the spelling of Baulch and from where John R. Balch may have come:

"All of Grandpa's [William Nicholas Baulch's] records in Sumner County (deeds to land, etc.), the name was spelled B A L C H. You may recall that Uncle Alfred spelled his name 'Balch.' We thought, of course, that he was the one who was 'out of step.' Also, all my references were for this spelling. I am positive that, though I've never found why, Grandpa changed it about 1830 and the original spelling is correct. ... Since the only folk story repeated about the Balch family was that the John Balch who came to Sumner County when he had run away from home was that his sister had lost her wedding dress when crossing the Green River. I thought this would be easy [to research] but that river crosses up and down and across Kentucky from one end to the other."

D La Pierre Ballard (a fourth cousin, a fifth cousin, a double fifth cousin, twice a double fourth cousin once removed, and a quadruple fifth cousin of Howard Stone Baulch), who has done much research and gathered much information on the Stone and Baulch families, offers this perspective on the Baulch name: "Before 1850 names were as they were pronounced and any reasonable spelling was all right. Undoubtedly, Balch was the original, but Baulch was adopted to keep the 'ah' or 'au' sound rather than to let the 'a' go to the 'a' as in apple. My name Ballard did not have its spelling changed because the 'a' as in apple did not make it awkward to say. The early pronunciation of Ballard had the 'a' as in ball. You can see this if you see the movie, 'Mrs. Miniver', incidentally. In England, Ballard has the 'a' as in ball rather than the 'a' as in apple as it does here in America. The 'au' in Baulch is pronounced as the 'au' as in author."

A potential father of John R. Balch could be John Baulch who served in the War of 1812 in Allison's Regiment of the East Tennessee Militia. No research has been done on his family.

Gene Edward Balch, a 12th generation descendant of John Balch (1631-1690) who settled in Lord Baltimore's Maryland Colony in 1658, offers another possibility. Gene has researched the Balch family for over thirty years. He believes "that John R. Balch may be one and the same as young John Balch, son of William & Rebecca, of Sparta, Tennessee. This John Balch disappeared from the campsite during a trip with his two brothers and his mother, in about 1827-1828." He could be correct, even though William & Rebecca Balch of Sparta, Tennessee were born in Maryland and North Carolina, not in Scotland and Ireland as John R. Balch reported for the 1880 Census. The coincidence of family legends is striking.

The Balch DNA project received results from Gene Balch's testing in November 2009, comparing the John R. Balch line (Howard Baulch's DNA) with the Balch Family of Maryland. They matched on 37 markers, so there is a Balch connection somewhere between these two family lines.

Note that the census spells her last name as Balch.

Shooting Takes Place in Bishop's Home in Oak Cliff -- Woman Will Recover.

After shooting Mrs. Charles Bishop twice last night, L. W. Brazzel, a laundry employee, turned his pistol on himself and sent a bullet through the brain. The shooting took place in a bedroom at Mrs. Bishop's residence, 600 North Madison Avenue, in the North Loop section of Oak Cliff.

Brazzel died almost instantly. Mrs. Bishop was shot through the left breast and left arm. She was taken to St. Paul's Sanitarium. She is expected to recover.

Brazzel met Mrs. Bishop when she got off the car one block from her home as she was coming from work at the Union Station, where she is employed by the Union News Company. He shot her almost immediately after they entered the house.

Mrs. Bishop's 14-year-old daughter, Daisy, and Dutch Carroll of New Orleans, LA., an old friend of the family, were in the house at the time of the shooting. Daisy met her mother and Brazzel as they entered the door.

"Who is here with you?" Brazzel is said to have asked her.

"Dutch is here. He is in the kitchen reading the paper." she replied, according to her husband.

After walking into the bedroom adjoining the reception room, Brazzel opened fire. Mrs. Bishop ran to the back bedroom, where Carroll went to her assistance. The last bullet entered the right side of Brazzel's head.

Charles Bishop is a waiter at the Adolpus. He said last night that until two years ago he and his wife were friends of Mr. and Mrs. Brazzel and they frequently called at each other's homes. At that time, Brazzel threatened to kill Mrs. Bishop unless she went with him, he said.

Bishop said that his wife told him Thursday that Brazzel was bothering her again. He said that Brazzel had phoned Daisy, Mrs. Bishop's daughter, several days ago that he had a box of candy for her downtown, but when she got to the place where he said he would leave it, there was none.

Held Pistol on Her.

Mrs. Bishop said that she and Brazzel passed several men after getting off the car before they reached her home, but that Brazzel held a gun on her and told her that if she opened her mouth he would kill her. She said that Davis street, along which they were walking, was very dark and no one else could see the revolver.

Dutch Carroll lived in Dallas until about three months ago, rooming at the Bishop home. He returned to Dallas Thursday. Bishop told him yesterday to get something to eat and go on out to the house, he said.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Bishop are 33 years of age. They have been married four years. Daisy was her child by her first marriage.

Funeral arrangements for Brazzel had not been made last night. He was 47 years old and is survived by his wife, a son, Victor Brazzel; two daughters, Thelma and Blanche Brazzel, and a brother, Bennie Brazzel of Elmo."

Nelson was raised and schooled in Sumner county, Tennessee. It is recorded in the Stone Family Bible that he married Peryle Reynolds on December 22, 1929. Nonetheless, in the April 1930 census of Sumner County, he is recorded as living at home with his parents and that he is still single. There is no Peryle (or Pearl) Reynolds recorded in the 1930 census in Sumner County.

He was an instructor and educator in public and private schools almost his entire life. He was a schoolmaster at the "Baulch Junior School for Boys" in Park City, Kentucky before becoming an agriculture teacher at Gallatin High School, Gallatin, Tennessee. He lived most of his life on the Baulch homestead on Portland Road, Gallatin, Tennessee. He was quite active member in civic affairs and the Methodist Church. Nelson and his wife, Peryle, visited the Holy Land during the latter years of their life together; they always looked fondly upon that trip as an inspirational moment in their spiritual lives. After retiring from teaching, he and Peryle lived their remaining years at McKindree Manor, Hermitage, Tennessee. Nelson and Peryle had no children.

For the fiftieth wedding anniversary celebration of Nelson and Peryle, their niece, Sarah Baulch McGinley, and her husband, Dr. Jim McGinley, composed and led the singing of two songs. Given that their marriage was at Christmas time, it was appropriate that both songs were sung to Christmas melodies. One was to the tune of "Wassail, Wassail" and sung by Sarah and Jim, while the other was to the tune of "The Twelve Days of Christmas" where everyone joined in. The lyrics were as follows:

The fall term of the Morgan School for boys and the Petersburg Grammar School will open Monday, September 4. A capacity enrollment is expected at both schools.

Making up the fall term faculty for the Morgan School are: R. Kenneth Morgan, headmaster; Ernest F. Baulch, principal and mathematics; John G. Morgan, coach and social science; Thomas B. Clark, Latin; J. T. Johnson, English; J. H. Baulch, mathematics and business; Miss Juanita Rowell, Librarian; Miles McMillan, junior school principal; Mrs. Miles McMillan, science; Mrs. E. L. Mitchell, junior school."

He was founder and head schoolmaster of "Baulch Junior School for Boys" in Park City, Kentucky from 1946 to 1952. The following excerpt from a Baulch Junior School promotional booklet describes Ernest's teaching philosophy:

"It is quite reasonable that in dealing with boys for twenty years one should have learned some things and gained some convictions as to how to deal with boys to make them better - morally, spiritually, physically, mentally, and socially. These things because of limited time and space I am just going to jot down. Some will seem trite, some trivial, but in my experience of twenty years they have all borne fruit.

1. I have learned that there is some good in every boy and that good can be reached to such an extent as to make that good better and to thereby reduce the bad and increase the good.

2. I have learned that to be a boy's teacher one must truly be a learner in the group. I learn things I never knew from the boys I come to know regularly. No man, save Jesus Christ, can ever know it all; and much that is learned must come through experience, mellowed with age and kept ever young by constant contact with the youth of our land.

3. I have learned that a beginning teacher relies on theory and his sense of brain judgment, and that a seasoned teacher comes to depend on experience and deep seated convictions of his heart. The one thinks he knows and the other knows he knows.

4. I have learned that a boost that lifts a boy's spirit is better than a knock that depresses him. Things that to the casual eye seem unimportant are often profoundly important to a boy. Truly then, ridicule is not for teachers but wholesome humor is a valuable tool.

5. I have learned that it is not so much what you get as how you get it. In mathematics answers are so frequently a hindrance to learning.

6. I have learned that it pays to play square with a boy, to be truthful and to call a spade a spade. In so doing, I find frankness paves the way for an understood solution of many a difficult problem.

7. I have learned to trust boys and to believe them. I have seldom been deceived and I know suspicious men that are continually deceived.

8. I have learned that a boy away from home in a school needs a friend and that the teacher that is his friend is the one he will "work his head off" to please and satisfy.

9. I have learned that threats belong to a past age and that friendly co-operation gets far better results even with small boys.

10. I have learned that friendly rivalry is helpful and very conducive to learning when brought to play even in the classroom.

11. I have learned that God has made boys different and that no two boys can be handled in exactly the same way in order to get the best results.

12. I have learned that many a so-called poor student was a poor student just because the subject matter had never been put across to him. I have seen dumb boy come to life and be leaders in the class, and yet still be the dumb boy in some other class.

13. I have seen many a mischievous boy, always in trouble, become a model boy and an "A" student when his energy was challenged in some subject and he really became interested in it.

14. I have learned that the art of teaching can't be secured merely by attending a teachers college 4, 6 or even 7 years, but that it is more a matter of personality than training. Modern methods sometimes just about ruin what might have been a good teacher.

15. I have learned that better work is often done in some of these "disreputable" one room rural schools, as given down the road in certain current magazines than in some demonstration schools hitched on to teachers colleges with Ph.D.'s heading each of maybe ten departments.

16. I have learned that rules mean more when they are few and far between. Trees grow better that way too. A school operated with a few rules tends to lead to gentlemanly conduct for the sake of being gentlemen.

17. I have learned that it is better to learn the fundamental subjects well than to learn a multiplicity of subjects in a superficial, slovenly manner. So much tends to reflect in one's later life.

18. I have learned that for a boarding school to meet the needs of a small boy it must be a home school that really maintains the home atmosphere.

19. I have learned that it pays to listen to a boy talk. Often you can use what he says later on to get under his skin and inspire him to greater accomplishments.
20. I have learned that parents are anxious to cooperate when you show them that you are really trying to help their boy become a better boy.

Not to be numbered but of paramount importance and above all others, I have learned that the molding of a good character is more important than the instilling of vast knowledge.

Our slogan gleaned from 20 Years - 'Baulch Builds Better Boys' "

Ernest was an instructor at Columbia Military Academy in Columbia, Tennessee. He was the Superintendent of Caverna Independent School District, Kentucky, and the Director of Summer Head Start Program.

He was a Methodist minister in Petersburg, Tennessee at the Methodist Episcopal Church South. While teaching at Morgan Preparatory School, Petersburg, Tennessee and preaching at a rural church, he was asked to "fill in" at the Petersburg Presbyterian Church that was without a minister. After several months of doing this, the Presbytery said he could not preach regularly there as a Methodist. [See below.] He then was accepted and ordained as a Presbyterian minister. Chairman of Inservice Committee.

In a letter postmarked September 9, 1989 from James H. Baulch (age 74) to Howard S. Baulch: "... an 'abbreviated' statement as to the answer Ernest [F. Baulch] gave the Presbytery pertaining to their question of his belief in predestination.

When Ernest went before the Presbyterian council in regard to being accepted as a Presbyterian minister since he, as a Methodist minister, was preaching regularly in a Presbyterian church that did not have a minister, the matter of his belief in predestination came up.

His statement to them was that in regard to that question, he would give them two answers and they could then make their decision. He told them that he would give them first the answer that they probably desired which was the one contained in the Presbyterian doctrine and that his second answer would be his own personal belief whereby he did not believe in strict predestination as he did not believe that it was pre-destined as to whether or not he would be accepted by the Presbytery but that he believed that God had a plan for the world and that ultimately God's plan would succeed. He said that he might have received the call to be the minister of that church but that he could refuse the call (someone else would have to accept the call). If he was called to be a Presbyterian minister that his refusal to accept the call at that time did not mean that God would not make the call to him again.

Ernest never had, or never gave me, a copy of his written answer nor was it ever written out in any of his sermons that I had. He used it at times in sermons I heard and also in some meetings I attended during which he elaborated more, however, the main belief is that God's will in an overall viewpoint will be accomplished - God may have a job for Jim Baulch to do but Jim Baulch may not do it; so God will find someone else to hear his call.

I know that I got a lot of my beliefs from my brother as I lived with his [family] for a while, worked in a boarding school with him, and owned and operated a boy's boarding school with him, and it is hard for me to explain my own belief on predestination. I know that God's plan for the world will succeed, but I am not that sure that God's plan for Jim Baulch has succeeded. I just pray that one of his alternate plans will succeed. There is no way that I can believe in strict predestination when I look at the happenings in the world in this century or in any of the past nor can I explain Christ's statement that he lost only the one that was so predestined."

In his later years Ernest was the Sgt. of Arms of the Cave City Civitan Club, Kentucky, and served as the City Judge, Park City, Kentucky.

The middle name of Homer came from the man who delivered James into this world, Dr. Homer Reese. He was raised and schooled in Sumner County, Tennessee and spent his grammar school years at the Salem School building where he laughingly claimed he "was the smartest one in the eighth grade ... and the only one!" He attended Spartanburg Textile Industrial Institute (I.k.a. Spartanburg Junior College), the University of Tennessee, and Bowling Green College of Commerce from which he received his bachelor of science degree.

The 1935 yearbook of Spartanburg Textile Industrial Institute, "The Trail Blazer", lists Freshmen in attendance. On page 21, it lists "James Baulch, Gallatin, Tenn."

The 1936 yearbook of Spartanburg Textile Industrial Institute, "The Olympic", lists Sophomores in attendance. On page 10, it lists "Jim Baulch, Gallatin, VA (sic), 'What I must do concerns me, not what people think.'"

The 1938 yearbook of Bowling Green College of Commerce, "The Towers", lists the 1938 Seniors in attendance. On page 20, it lists "James H. Baulch, B. S., Gallatin, Tennessee, 'Most powerful is he who has himself in his own power.'"

After graduating from college, Jim became an instructor and business manager at Harrison-Stone-Jackson Agricultural High School and Junior College (I.k.a. Perkinston Junior College), where he met the student, Madie Gibson, who became his wife.

The record of Jim and Madie's marriage is in the Harrison County, Mississippi court book 50, page 640, where it indicates that they were married April 13, 1940 by H. C. Moore, Justice of the Peace.

He and Madie then traveled to Gallatin, Tennessee to visit his family, and they moved to Charlotte, North Carolina where he was a bookkeeper and instructor for Carolina Business College. At that time they lived at 410 West 8th in Charlotte. It was there that they started their family; Barbara Anne Baulch was born June 20, 1941. They later moved to 310 West 10th, Apt. 7 in Charlotte about 1943.

In 1944 Jim became a teacher at Morgan Preparatory School From the Lincoln County, Tennessee newspaper, August 24, 1944:

"Social Happenings At Petersburg  
Morgan School

The fall term of the Morgan School for boys and the Petersburg Grammar School will open Monday, September 4. A capacity enrollment is expected at both schools.

Making up the fall term faculty for the Morgan School are: R. Kenneth Morgan, headmaster; Ernest F. Baulch, principal and mathematics; John G. Morgan, coach and social science; Thomas B. Clark, Latin; J. T. Johnson, English; J. H. Baulch, mathematics and business; Miss Juanita Rowell, Librarian; Miles McMillan, junior school principal; Mrs. Miles McMillan, science; Mrs. E. L. Mitchell, junior school."

Jim then moved the family to Lewisburg, Tennessee where he worked as a hospital administrator. Soon another career opportunity summoned him to Glasgow, Kentucky where he worked in hospital administration at T. J. Samson Community Hospital.

In 1946 he joined his brother, Ernest, as schoolmaster at "Baulch Junior School for Boys" in Park City, Kentucky. Together they and their wives (Ernest, Nelle, Jim and Madie) were the teachers of all subjects required for the private school for boys. BJS records show pupils came from across the United States as well as abroad to enjoy a disciplined and well rounded education. While at Baulch Junior School, the Baulch family expanded with the birth of Sarah Lee Baulch on August 26, 1948 in Glasgow (the nearest hospital to Park City).

Realizing that the private school did bring enough income to support two families, Jim and family moved to Hopkinsville, Kentucky in 1950 where he was Business Manager for Hopkinsville Lincoln-Mercury and bookkeeper for Hopkinsville Auto Parts until 1958. He was then recruited by Oak Motors of Nashville, Tennessee to be their Assistant Business Manager. In 1959 he was recruited by Jim Burke Buick of Birmingham, Alabama to be Business Manager of the largest Buick dealership in Alabama. In 1964 he followed his doctor's advice to find a less stressful job and moved to Slidell, Louisiana to be Business Manager and part owner of John Brown Olds (later Tom Brown Olds-Buick, Del Williams Motors, and Bill Ward Motors), Slidell, Louisiana until his retirement in 1986 (excepting for a brief return to Birmingham, Alabama to help out Jim Burke Buick in 1971).

James Baulch was received into membership of the Salem Methodist Church, north of Gallatin, Sumner County, Tennessee in October 1929 by his brother, Rev. Ernest F. Baulch. He remained an active member of the United Methodist Church his entire life, holding numerous positions on its boards and committees and taught an Adult Sunday School Class for over 30 years. He was an ardent believer in maintaining a healthy body, engaging in a variety of exercise programs, particularly those centered around running. He won numerous awards for finishing top in his age group for 10K and 5K runs through age 76. Having been raised on a farm, the "farmer blood" never left him. He maintained a vegetable garden wherever he lived and helped his children establish ones for themselves.

Largely due to his active life style, he looked and acted younger than his years. He was admired and

respected by his friends and family for his physical, mental, and spiritual strength. He was the epitome of reliability: if he promised he would do something, he did it as committed and did it well. While quite introverted, he was a friend to anyone who needed him, often selflessly sacrificing himself in support of others. Friends and family knew they could count on him.

He and his wife, Madie, lived a beautiful fifty-two years together. They were always committed to each other, to their family, to their church, and to their friends. They were both victims of a tragic car accident (being hit broadside by a one-ton truck that ran through an inoperative red light) in May 1992 and were hospitalized for over a month. With two brain hemorrhages and numerous broken bones, recovery was slow and physical therapy was difficult. Six months later, a massive stroke put Jim in a deep, irreversible coma. With no hope of a functional life, his family followed his often repeated request if such an occasion arose. He was taken home and removed from life support systems. He died on November 24, 1992, two days before Thanksgiving. It was as he would have liked it: he was at home in his own bed, kept warm by the quilt made by his mother that had been a wedding gift to Madie and him, and surrounded by his family. Madie, all three children, and all their spouses were there, singing hymns from the United Methodist Hymnal. It was during his son Howard's singing of "How Great Thou Art" that he breathed his last breath here on earth. His son-in-law, Floyd Duvall, fittingly read the Twenty-Third Psalm as he joined the angels in heaven.

Originally, Jim was placed in a mausoleum in Forest Lawn Cemetery, Slidell, Louisiana. After Madie moved to Franklin, Tennessee in September 1997, he was moved to his final burial place in Woodlawn Memorial Park in Nashville, Tennessee, near his parents and his brother, Nelson Howard Baulch.

She was raised in Bond, Mississippi and attended Harrison-Stone-Jackson Agricultural High School and Junior College (later known as Perkinston Junior College).

"Mr. Abner Gibson announces the marriage of his daughter Miss Madie Gibson to Mr. James H. Baulch, son of Mr. G. N. Baulch of Gallatin, Tenn. The groom is a graduate of Bowling Green Commercial Law School of Bowling Green, Kentucky and has been bookkeeping instructor and business manager at Perkinston Junior College (sic) for two years when he resigned to take a position in Tennessee. The bride is a graduate of Perkinston High School. The young couple left as soon as his work was completed at the Junior College. They will be at his home in Gallatin, Tenn."

Madie was an accomplished seamstress, making clothes for her children and thirteen grandchildren. She was an active member of the United Methodist Church, having held numerous positions on church boards and committees. One of her greatest gifts is her contributions to the Altar Guild and, more directly, the talent she has with the flower arrangements for the church services. When Jim entered semi-retirement, they enjoyed travels to West Germany, Austria, England, Canada, and Brazil. Life was difficult for Madie after Jim died in November 1992. In September 1997 she moved from Slidell, Louisiana to Morningside Assisted Living at 105 Sunrise Circle in Franklin, Tennessee. As her health deteriorated, she spent time in NHC Place of Franklin and then moved to Southern Care at 3595 Carothers Parkway in Franklin in 2007. In 2008 she moved to Claiborne Hughes Health Center located at 200 Strahl Street in Franklin. It was there that she had a major stroke on Friday, July 3, 2009. The children were summoned, and one or more of them was usually at her bedside until her death on Thursday, July 9. On the day of her death she was sung to and comforted by her daughters Sarah and Barbara, her son Howard, her son-in-law Floyd, and her daughter-in-law Sally. Her son-in-law Jim came as soon as possible as her breathing became labored, but he was unable to arrive before her death.
